Overview:

The Star Homes project is based on a randomised controlled trial to estimate the health benefits of housing improvements on child health in rural Mtwara, one of the more underdeveloped regions of Tanzania, with a high incidence of malaria, respiratory tract infections, and diarrhoea. Star Homes combine a series of design features to improve health. The trial compares disease rates in children living in Star Homes with rates in children in traditional homes. A paper showing that indoor mosquito abundance in Star Homes compared to traditional homes has been reduced by half, was published in April 2025.
